### FACING CHALLENGES AND DISCOURAGEMENT ON MISSION

David Platt acknowledges that anybody in ministry will face some sort of challenge and discouragement. Reflecting on Acts 20 and his own ministry experience, he gives three words of encouragement to the discouraged person in ministry.

### THE FREEDOM TO PRESS "PAUSE"

Trillia Newbell explains the need all humans have for prolonged periods of rest. Using anecdotes, Scripture and quotes from various pastors, she encourages us to throw off our tendency to act like we are selfsufficient and to rest in the Lord.

### FAMILIAL SUSTAINABILITY

Heather Thompson Day discusses what's needed for your family's health in the midst of ministry. She acknowledges the challenges planters face and explains how to protect yourself and your family in difficult times.

### PRIORITIZING PHYSICAL HEALTH
