WHO WE ARE

In 2003 Carrie and I were married and moved to Louisville, KY for me to attend seminary to receive training in gospel ministry. During our time at school the Lord began to form a desire for church planting in our hearts. We began to pursue church planting, but God in his timing stopped us for diving into church planting at that time. Upon graduating from Southern Seminary in 2007 I joined the staff of First Baptist Church Waynesboro, GA



as their Youth Pastor, a role I filled for nearly eight years.

Early in 2014 we began to seek the Lord concerning the direction of our lives and ministry in the future. As we prayed and considered what the Lord would do with us for the remainder of our ministry, the desire to plant a church began to grow again. We prayed, listened, and explored. I sought the counsel of mentors and mature brothers in Christ as to whether they saw the Lord calling me to this work. These faithful brothers confirmed what we thought the Lord was telling us. At this time through conversations with trusted brothers and sisters in Christ the Lord directed us to Washington, DC. We then began the process of preparing to leave our church family in Waynesboro in order to relocate to the DC metro area to begin a church planting residency at Sterling Park Baptist Church. Additionally I sought support, training and partnership through the North American Mission Board (NAMB) and the Southern Baptist Conservatives of Virginia (SBCV). Upon receiving approval and affirmation we followed the Lord's call.

In June 2015 we were sent out by First Baptist Church Waynesboro as missionaries and moved to the DC Metro area to begin this new phase of preparation and ministry. Upon arrival in the DC area I began the church planting residency. We are now preparing to launch out into the mission field We are convinced that the Bible shows us that the way to reach out to people who do not know Jesus is through planting gospel-centered churches. This is our aim. This is why we are here.

why dc?

As U.S. cities go, one would be hard pressed to name a more influential city in our nation than Washington DC. As the seat of our nations government and growing place of modern industry, DC is a city of power. DC is also a city of great lostness. there are very few evangelical churches for the large population.

why dc metro?

While the District of Columbia is small, the metropolitan footprint of DC extends into Virginia and Maryland. 600,000 people live in the district while 2.6



million people live in the DC metro area. Simply put, the DC metro area is in desperate need of gospel centered churches.

why gainesville—bristow?

As the DC metro area grows, communities filled with new construction are growing at an exponential rate. Large numbers of new homes are being built in Gainesville—Bristow area and the population continues to grow at an exponential rate. As follower of Jesus we have been charged with taking the gospel to the nations. Jesus' plan for Kingdom growth is the local church, and there are simply not enough churches in the Gainesville—Bristow area to reach the rapidly growing population. Out of obedience to the savior and passion for the glory of God we are planting a church in this community.


